


## **Tips for Land Access**

Agriculture and mining are both necessary industries for the Australian economy, and good relationships are the foundation of ensuring the long-term success of both. Once trust has been established, acceptance is granted.

Based on AMETS experience, we have formulated the below suggestions to hopefully assist miners/explorers to foster positive relationships with the landowner.



## Remember

Both the Title holder and the landholders have obligations towards each other, and it is within everyone's best interest to work together and develop workable solutions that wherever possible, minimise any adverse impacts on both the landholder's operations and the exploration program.

Explorers/miners should establish long-term relationships with landholders based on courtesy and respect. Once an agreement has been established, the title holder should stay in regular contact with the landholder to advise them of any changes to the activity. If the title holder breaches any conditions of the agreement, a landholder may deny them access to the land until the breach is remedied.

Although the minerals under the ground belong to the Government, explorers/miners are provided a licence to undertake certain activities to operate on the land. It is important to remember, the land is private land and explorers/miners remain as visitors.
