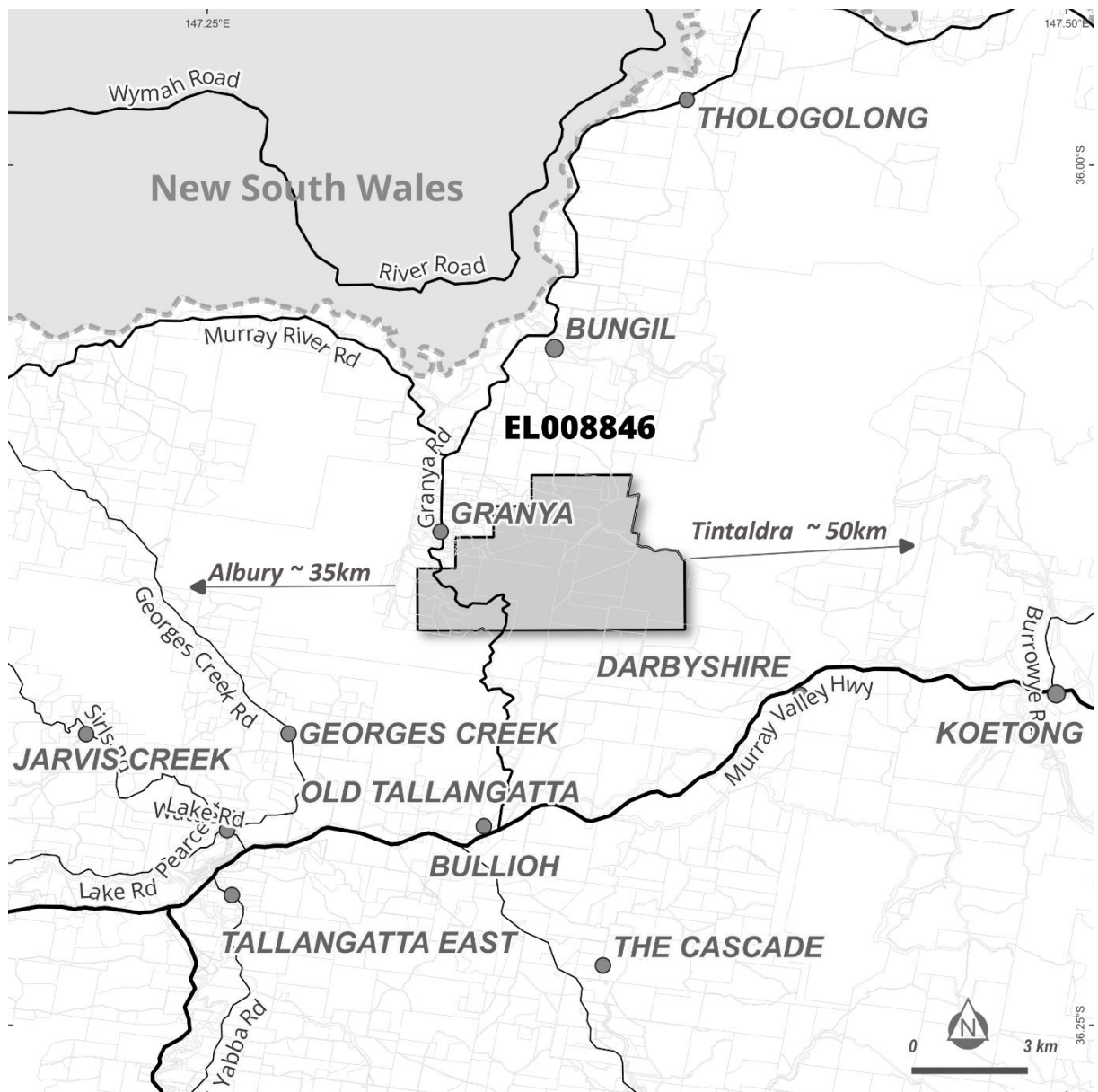

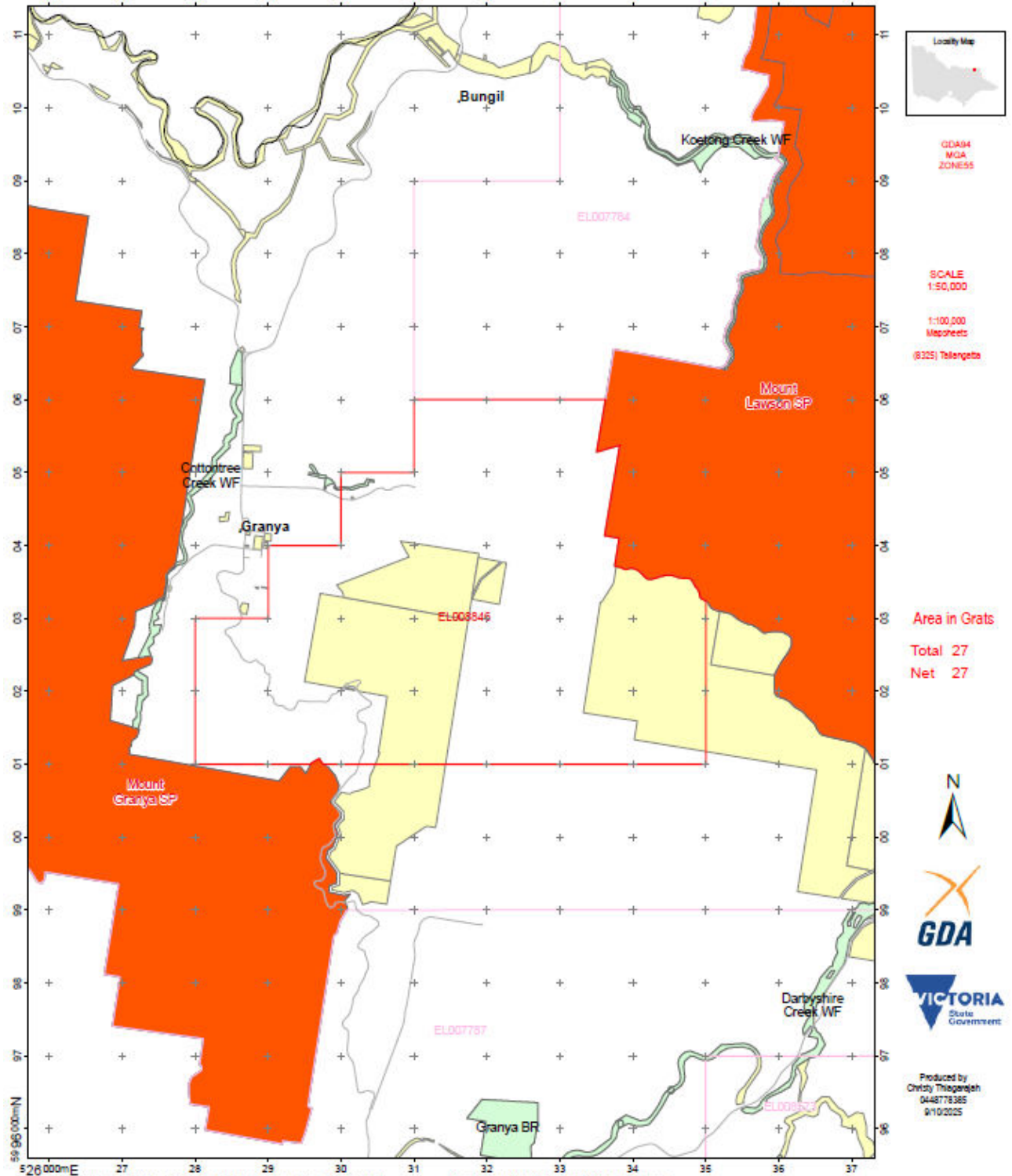
PLAN OF AREA EL008846

Work Program

YEAR 1

- Confirm structure and geology with detailed mapping
- Acquisition of Lidar dataset over the entire tenement area.
- Interrogation of above datasets and identification and prioritisation of target areas.
- Conduct landholder negotiations and develop land access agreements across target areas.

YEAR 2 - 3

- Define targets along shear corridor.
 - geochemical sampling
 - geological mapping
 - drill testing of identified targets.

YEAR 3 - 5

- Validate grade and continuity
- Channel sampling and 3–5 scissor holes under old stopes
- Test depth extensions - drill density aimed at establishing economic continuity
- RC/DD drilling down plunge of Firebrace Reef
- Evaluate and assess resource potential – develop Mineralisation Model
- Develop Mineralisation Model consistent with JORC compliance – assess Work Plans for Development
- Evaluate further drilling or Decision to Mine

Environment Strategy

All rehabilitation will be carried out as soon as is practicable after exploration activities have taken place and in line with the current Guidelines for environmental management in exploration and mining.

Silver Sons Metals Pty Ltd will ensure all staff and contractors are aware of all site-specific environmental sensitivities, such as weeds and endangered flora and fauna and will act accordingly.

Silver Sons Metals Pty Ltd are committed to minimising or where possible avoiding environmental impact and will work in accordance with the Guidelines as determined by the Victorian Government and will facilitate effective rehabilitation of all disturbed areas.

No wetlands, waterways or lakes will be impacted by exploration activities.

Community Engagement Plan

In general terms, the Silver Sons Metals Pty Ltd's community engagement plan is broadly based on the following:

To identify individuals or groups which may be impacted by the operations on the licence. This would involve the compilation of a list of adjacent landowners, persons living on or in the vicinity of the licence and other community groups which may be impacted by the operations.

Silver Sons Metals Pty Ltd will need to assess the impact of their operation on these individuals and groups. Following the consultation, the full impact would be assessed by guidelines provided by the Department.

An assessment will be made following the consultation as to what level of community input and involvement can be achieved. There are likely to be a range of matters which may need to be considered. Ideally, many of the ideas and suggestions will be mutually beneficial to both the licensee and the local community.

Any contact or complaint will be noted in a complaints book, and Silver Sons Metals Pty Ltd will promptly make suitable arrangements to contact the complainant. Where possible, the matter would be settled between the two parties, but the local Inspector or the Mining Warden may be requested to assist in resolving any issue or mediating on the matter. Such interaction with the community will be used to identify any issues that may be arising from the operations on the licence and will attempt to accommodate the views of the stakeholders in dealing with any such issues.

Silver Sons Metals Pty Ltd is mindful of the need to maintain these exceptionally good community relations and to ensure that the channels of communication between the licence holder and the community in which it operates are kept open. All discussion with the community is based on mutual trust and respect.
